Tsenay Serequeberhan received his Ph.D. in philosophy at Boston College in 1988. Eritrean by origin, he is a teacher of philosophy whose work is grounded in the Continental tradition and focused on African/Africana philosophy and Social-Political philosophy. His teaching and research critically explore and engage the intersection of these areas of scholarly concern. He has taught at various institutions of higher learning including Hampshire College and Brown University and is presently an Associate Professor of Philosophy at Morgan State University. He is the author of *African Philosophy: The Essential Readings* (Paragon, 1991), *The Hermeneutics of African Philosophy: Horizon and Discourse* (Routledge, 1994), *Our Heritage: The Past in the Present of African-American and African Existence* (Rowman & Littlefield, 2000), *Contested Memory: The Icons of the Occidental Tradition* (Africa World Press, 2007), and numerous papers in African, Africana, and Continental philosophy.
